

Sri Lanka's tourist sites are famous. But not the Kuveni Circuit.

Kuveni was not simply a wife and weaver of cloth, a mother, lover, and queen - but also a demon, a metamorphoser, an outcast, an avenging fury, suicide, traitor, murderess, ghost, and mistress of deception.

A descendant of gods, she is also a goddess to the country's still living aboriginal peoples. "We may be forest haunters," said a Vedda leader recently, "but Kuveni our goddess."

Wife of the founding father of the Singhala people over 2,500 years ago, she was hurled down a mountain top, cursing her disloyal husband. "The curse," wrote an observer, "was not only on Vijaya but the descendants of Hela People (Singhala) as a whole." In following her wreathlike footsteps, which are still, from time to time, just about discernible in certain parts of the island, one puts together not just a travel schedule like no other; but one that takes you into the secret heart of the country itself.

Most of what passes as cinnamon sold worldwide is as counterfeit as a North Korean election.

True cinnamon, or Cinnamomum Zeylanicum, comes almost wholly from Sri Lanka. Its phony forger, Chinese Cassia Cinnamon, has a thick, rough bark and a harsh, crude flavour, at odds with any kind of foodie rapture.




Ananda and the hotel gardening team, in a fever of self-sufficiency, have just added another 1208 new cinnamon bushes to the 1,300 already planted.

Once, when life was straightforward and all ketchups were Heinz, Sri Lanka had but a single endemic loris, the Red Slender Loris. But a slight of geography enabled its mammals to develop on their own terms, when the land bridge to India collapsed. Suddenly, every species left on the Sir Lankan side had the perfect conditions to go native. And native they went - the island's endemic-ness is unparalleled in Asia: 16% of its faun'a and 23% of its plants are home grown - like the loris. Chandra, a housekeeper at The Flame Tree Estate, is adamant that it was the red loris she saw. Living in a hamlet abutting the estate, she recalls its reddish fur and vast eyes.

Not without some trepidation. In island folklore the loris cries calls the devils. She sighting was exceptional. At 150 grams, lorises are so tiny as to be easily missed. And nocturnal, sleeping the day through in leaf covered tree holes. They are so rare




as to classified as highly endangered. They are a textbook example of what happens when species evolve as they wish. Sri Lanka's loris are the mammalian equivalent of Darwin's finches. What was thought to be a single species is in fact 2 different sub species, one of which localised further into 2 sub sub species. The Horton Plains Slender L'oris keeps itself to the mountains of southcentral Sri Lanka. The Western Red Slender Loris, lives in lowland jungle but also created the Northern Ceylon Slender Loris (dry zone forests); and the Highland Slender Loris – found on hills, like the one on which Chandra lives.


Shaymalee's Coconut

Statistical pundits report that 150 people die annually from falling coconuts worldwide. It is an irksome - if environmentally positive - way to depart this earth; and most escape with just a few bruises - like Shyamalee, Head Housekeeper at home last week. "I heard a whoosh from above and turned my head; the coconut hit my shoulder not my head." The island produces over 3 million nuts a year - but consumes 5 million. Planting new saplings is an act of gastronomic patriotism. The Hotel's hundreds of hundred-year-old coconut trees, are key to making its sambals and drinks. And, you may be glad to hear, safely cropped regularly by the same family that has tended them for over 4 generations.





bomb..." it begins.


"I would like," lamented the artist Claude Monet (rarely given to complaints), "to paint the way a bird sings."
