

THE TRUTH ABOUT CINNEMON

Most of what passes as cinnamon sold worldwide is as counterfeit as a North Korean election. True cinnamon, or *Cinnamomum Zeylanicum*, comes almost wholly from Sri Lanka. Its phony forger, *Chinese Cassia Cinnamon*, has a thick, rough bark and a harsh, crude flavour, at odds with any kind of foodie rapture. Here at the hotel, Ananda and his gardening team, in a fever of self-sufficiency, have just added another 1208 new cinnamon bushes to the 1,300 already planted. The plants will grow as 10 foot bushes, their inner branches peeled and harvested after 3 years. Come taste.
